ABOUT THE WORKSHOP. Muscle Channel Massage's theory is based on the muscle channels and their functions. In theory, the muscle channels are energetically responsible for proper function of the muscles, tendons, and ligaments. The twelve bilateral muscle channels constitute a part of the meridian system in Traditional Chinese Medicine. Muscle channels are more on the periphery of the body and are named for the twelve primary meridians whose courses they generally follow: bladder, kidney, stomach, spleen, liver, gall bladder, pericardium, triple warmer, heart, small intestine, lung, and large intestine. Time tested MCM concepts are used to work WITH this system. The body is viewed as a series of interconnecting rivers moving towards exit points. The intent of the MCM treatment is to clear the muscle channels of obstructions inhibiting the flow of energy. This clearing restores the ultimate function to the muscles, tendons, and ligaments. Client involvement and interaction with the therapist is vital in the process of change. Results are dynamic and longer lasting than conventional massage methods. The massage therapist's role is the tour director of this adventure. With their hands they can feel, sense, see, think, know, wonder, and manifest change in the physical body by working WITH the Muscle Channel Massage concepts.
